

# From Small Steps, to Long Treks & Wide Open Views

At Tesoro Viejo there are more than 15 miles of trails suitable for walking, jogging and biking that lead you through the natural landscape and back home. Refresh, rejuvenate, and enjoy the beauty of nature. Trails are open from dawn to dusk. Dogs are welcome—please pick up after your pet. Be mindful of our native wildlife.

- 1 Tesoro Viejo Trail**
  - 3.5 Miles
  - Moderate to Difficult
  - Character: Dirt

Start your adventure at Town Center and explore a picturesque landscape all the way to the San Joaquin River. The hike begins with a leisurely stroll to Beavers Pond. Then it's onward along the creek bed lined with Poplar trees that provide a natural landmark. You'll pass Beaver's House where you can marvel at the beaver dam, Vulture's Rock, a prime location for bird watching, and Kissing Gate, the gateway leading hikers to the serenity of Old Oak Grove with its majestic trees or down to the San Joaquin River.



- 3 Lyles' Greenway Trail**
  - 0.7 Miles
  - Easy
  - Character: Dirt

This linear park runs along the western edge of Creekside Village and serves as a direct link to Beavers Pond and Rosie's Place, the off-leash dog park. The north end of the Greenway connects to Hillside Village via a covered pedestrian bridge, and the south end of this parkway links to The Plaza Trail.



- 6 Tesoro Nuevo Trail**
  - 2.2 Miles
  - Moderate
  - Character: Dirt

Flat and winding, with sections passing alongside quiet pools, the trail leads you past the foot of Little Table Mountain and wanders to the creek bed, where it links to Creekside Connection.

- 2 The Plaza Trail**
  - 1.2 Miles
  - Easy
  - Character: Paved

An urban trail lined with trees, The Plaza Trail is an easy stroll with connection north to Hillside Village, the Town Center, and east to Creekside Connection and beyond.



- 5 Creekside Connection**
  - 1.8 Miles
  - Easy to Moderate
  - Character: Paved and Dirt

Linking Hillside Village to Tesoro Viejo's network of trails, Creekside Connection winds along natural open space and the creek bed, for a lovely way to begin or end an excursion.



- 8 Lost Oaks Trails**
  - 1.7 Miles
  - Moderate to Difficult
  - Character: Dirt

A hike along historic farm roads, climbing up to a "Dam Fine View" from the top with sweeping views of the Sierra Mountains, arroyos and Friant Dam. Then descend down along the arroyo and connect back to the Tesoro Viejo Trail. Stop by Beaver's House and Vulture's Rock and be awed by the natural world.



- 4 Hillside Loop Trail**
  - 3.7 Miles
  - Easy to Moderate
  - Character: Paved

The Hillside Loop Trail encircles Hillside Village and meanders around Buck Meadow—a preserved open space in the heart of the Village, and where bucks have been sighted. A spur leads to the Tesoro Nuevo and Creekside Connection trails, access points for the rest of Tesoro Viejo's sprawling trail network.



- 7 Lost Winds Trail**
  - 1.7 Miles
  - Moderate
  - Character: Dirt

Encircling the Arroyo Village, the Lost Winds Trail wanders past natural open space and wetlands. This trail connects to both Big Canyon and Creekside Connection trails, with access points to the rest of the extensive network of trails.



- 9 Big Canyon Trail**
  - 2.0 Miles
  - Moderate
  - Character: Dirt

Connecting to both the Tesoro Viejo Trail and Creekside Connection, this trail winds past the Tesoro Viejo Tree Nursery and The Grotto, a unique rock formation. Take in views while hiking around fields en route to or from the Kissing Gate.

### Respect Our Natural World

Keep these tips in mind to maximize your trail time and ensure the serenity of our environment for all who wander here.

- Please stay on marked trails and leave wildlife undisturbed
- Dogs must be on a leash
- Bags and trash cans are provided for waste disposal
- Smoking, vaping, alcoholic beverages, and motorized vehicles are prohibited
- Be mindful of vehicular traffic and farming operations

### Beavers Pond

- A scenic pond where owls, turtles, and other wildlife can be spotted
- Open lawn play areas and access to Creekside residential neighborhood



### Vulture's Rock

Be sure to stop at Vulture's Rock, a prime location for bird watching.



### Kissing Gate

The gateway leading hikers to the serenity of Old Oak Grove with its majestic trees or down to the San Joaquin River.



### "Dam Fine View"

Take in the sweeping views of the Sierra Mountains, the arroyos and of course, Friant Dam.
